Speaker biographical note



Sarfaroz Niyozov is Acting Associate Dean, academic programs, Ontario Institute for Studies in Education (OISE), University of Toronto (Canada). He is also an Associate Professor within the departments of <u>Curriculum Studies and</u> <u>Teacher Development</u> and <u>Comparative and International</u> Education. His research focuses on education in Tajikistan and the broader Central Asian region, especially in terms of teacher training and perspectives. He holds a PhD in Curriculum Studies and Teacher Development from OISE, University of Toronto, where his dissertation won the Outstanding Dissertation from both the Comparative International Education Society and the American Education Research Association. He also earned an M.Ed in Teacher Education from Aga Khan University (Pakistan), along with dual a BA and B.Ed degree in Arabic Philology from Tajik State University. He had another degree in Arabic Studies from Tajik State University and Moscow Institute of Oriental Studies derailed to a civil war. He credits this diverse educational background for inspiring his Critical Pragmatism Framework for research and pedagogy.
